













Profile:

- The candidate will have an outstanding record of behaviour, attendance, punctuality and uniform and have leadership potential.
- The successful candidates will be selected through written application, interview and presentations in front of the school community..

General roles and responsibilities

- To work within and lead the student leadership team.
- To meet, feedback and contribute to the SLT to raise standards in and out of the classroom and the wider Harleston community.
- To lead assemblies.
- To fulfil duties in and out of school as required by SLT, including presentation evenings and Remembrance Day.
- To oversee the duty rota system.
- To liaise with the Pastoral Team, AHT, DHT and HoS.

SSLT* (Year 11)

Profile:

- The SSLT epitomise the Sancroft A Game and are an exemplary role model to all students.
- The candidate will have an outstanding record of behaviour, attendance, punctuality and uniform and have leadership potential.
- The successful candidates will be selected through written application and interview.

General roles and responsibilities.

Duties comprise, but not limited to the following:

- To be attached to a staff member of SLT to perform duties as directed to raise standards in and outside of the classroom and the wider Sancroft community.
- To ensure that student leaders register their activity/duty on a designated day.
- To oversee student leaders on their duties.
- To report to Head students where responsibilities are not being adhered to.

*SSLT will be appointed as part of the Head student application process.

House Captains (Year 11)

Profile:

- The House Captains will epitomise the Sancroft A Game and be an exemplary role model to all students.
- The candidates will have an outstanding record of behaviour, attendance, punctuality and uniform and have leadership potential.
- The successful candidate(s) will be selected through written application and interview.

General roles and responsibilities.

- To perform duties as directed by your HoH.
- To support the Head Students and the prefect system
- To represent and organise your house in events
- To organise your selected house charity event.
- To be involved in whole school activities and events.
- To work within the cluster as required.
- To perform duties at designated lunch times.

Sports Captains (Year 11)

Profile:

- The Sports Captains will epitomise the Sancroft A Game and be an exemplary role model to all students for the full range of sports.
- The candidates will have an outstanding record of behaviour, attendance, punctuality and uniform and have leadership potential.
- The successful candidate(s) will be selected through written application and interview.

General roles and responsibilities.

- Organise house teams to represent your house.
- To support the prefect and student ambassador system and become involved in management and deployment of prefects with Head Students
- Organise one whole school sporting event in conjunction with other Sports Captains
- To be involved in sporting activities and events.
- To work within the cluster on sports days and events as required.
- To perform duties at designated lunch times.

Prefects (Year 10 and 11)

Profile:

- The House Prefects will epitomise the Sancroft A Game and be an excellent role model to all students.
- The candidates will have a recent outstanding record of behaviour, attendance, punctuality and uniform, have leadership potential and be able to work as a team.
- The candidates may have had challenges in the past, but will have shown resolve and dedication to overcome these. Applicants can be from current year 9 and 10. The successful candidates will be selected through written application and interview.

General roles and responsibilities:

- To represent your house.
- To be involved in whole school activities and events.
- To work with the perfect team to organise a charity event per house.
- To work within the cluster as required.
- To perform duties at designated lunch times.

Mental Health Leaders

(Year 10 and 11)

Profile:

- The Mental Health Leaders epitomise the Sancroft A Game and are an exemplary role model to all students.
- The candidate will need to have experience and or interest in raising awareness of mental health issues / well-being and supporting others.
- The candidate will have an outstanding record of behaviour, attendance, punctuality and uniform and have leadership potential.
- The successful candidates will be selected through written application, interview and presentations in front of the school community.

General roles and responsibilities.

- To work within and lead the student leadership team.
- To meet, feedback and contribute to the SLT to raise standards in and out of the classroom and the wider Harleston community.
- To lead assemblies.
- To fulfil duties in and out of school as required by SLT, including organising charity days, training events, and to support fellow students and staff with well-being.
- To organise the presence of Mental Health Leaders in and around school.
- To liaise with Head of Year 11, HoH, AHT, DHT and HoS.

 Alternatively, you may wish to write a formal letter of application, this would be highly recommended for Head Student applicants.
- Deadline Applications must be emailed to
 Mrs R-B by 3:30 pm on <u>Thursday 16th June</u>.
 Hand written copies should also be submitted to the school office for the attention of Mrs R-B by this time.

Timescales

Thursday / Friday 9th / 10th June

 Student application process to go live. Current Year 9 and Year 10 students receive an email from Mrs R-B outlining the application process. Details are advertised on the school twitter account and Form Tutors to inform students, and support as necessary.

Thursday 16th June - 1530

- · Deadline for student leader applications via email to Mrs R-B.
- · Head student applications forwarded to the Senior Leadership Team.
- House Captain, Sports Captain, Mental Health Leaders and Prefect applications to appropriate Head of House.

Monday 20th June

- · The Senior Leadership Team to shortlist and inform Mrs R-B of successful candidates.
- Mr R-B to inform successful/unsuccessful candidates by letter.

Thursday/Friday 23rd / 24th June

Head student interviews with members of the Senior Leadership Team

Tuesday / Wednesday 28th / 29th June:


- · Forms to watch Hustings in the quad.
- Students vote at the end of form time for their preferred candidate.

Friday 1st July:

- Head students to be formally announced.
- Student Leader, House Captain, Mental Health Leaders and Sports Captain applicants to be interviewed by Heads of House over the next couple of days.

Wednesday 6th July:

Student leaders, House Captains, Mental Health Leaders and Sports Captains applicants to be informed
of the outcome of applications and interviews by the relevant HoH.
