Have you signed up to ClassDojo yet? We use ClassDojo to share learning, events, dates, information and to celebrate our amazing children.


The service is free (ignore any pop-ups asking you to subscribe - you don't need to, just click on the X or 'not now'.


Choir will be starting up for KS2 Pupils on Thursdays after school until 4pm.

What is a DSL?

A designated safeguarding lead (DSL) is a member of staff who has received specialist training in whole school safeguarding. A DSL will manage safeguarding in school, deliver training to all staff and will also work with outside agencies to help keep children safe.

A DSL will also follow up any concerns that have been raised about the safety and wellbeing of a child.



If you have concerns about the safety and wellbeing of a child, then you can always pass this on to a member of staff. Alternatively, any member of the public can ring the Norfolk Children's Advice and Duty Service (CADS) on 0344 800 8020.

Sometimes following up safeguarding questions means having difficult conversations with parents and carers. These conversations are necessary in order to do our job and to develop our understanding of a situation and what we can do to help.

Improving our school grounds and habitats for nature

POND AREA

Climate change and global warming is having a negative impact on our wildlife and at the primary phase of the school, we are very lucky to have wonderful school grounds which incorporate a wooded area, haymeadow and now, a revamped pond area enabling wildlife to flourish, something we as a school are passionate about.

Our school pond area, situated on the path down from the office to the lower school playground, had become overgrown and inaccessible to the children, but thanks to some wonderful, hard workers from the Waveney Volunteers for Nature, it has now been cleared and tidied thus creating a beautiful, tranquil place for nature, our children and learning. The volunteers had a 'work out,' cutting down overgrown trees, branches, bushes to reveal a natural path, mound and of course the pond which is currently home to a number of frogs. They also found some unwanted balls, hoops, containers and bats! Thanks to their hard work, our children will be able to see nature first hand through pond dipping, observing the resident minibeasts and simply enjoy the peace and calm it offers.

An enormous thank you to the five volunteers for their hard work in improving accessibility to the pond area and enabling our children to be at one with nature. We are now hoping to add some seating to the pond area and if anyone has or is willing to donate an unwanted bench, we would be most grateful.

In order for the pond area to remain accessible, we are looking for a working party of volunteers who are willing to offer a few hours each month to maintain the area. If this is something that is of interest to you, or you would like to help develop our grounds in any other way eg creating a vegetable patch, flower garden, help clear the wooded area etc, please let the school office know. Our aim is to continue our pledge to support nature, wildlife and help our children understand the need to create a relationship with the natural world.


Year 3

Year 4









We've had a great first week back. In computing, we have been creating systems for talking toys.
