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

Join us at the book fair!


Once again we have the scholastic book fair in school! The book fair will be held in the school library from 3.15pm on the following dates.



What is a DSL?

A designated safeguarding lead (DSL) is a member of staff who has received specialist training in whole school safeguarding. A DSL will manage safeguarding in school, deliver training to all staff and will also work with outside agencies to help keep children safe.

A DSL will also follow up any concerns that have been raised about the safety and wellbeing of a child. If you have concerns about the safety and wellbeing of a child, then you can always pass this on to a member of staff. Alternatively, any member of the public can ring the **Norfolk Children's Advice and Duty Service (CADS) on 0344 800 8020.**

Celebrating Our Children








We are enjoying our weekly visits to the library where we share stories and engage in book talk.
