Message from Mrs Price

What started out as a bright and sunny week ended in torrential rain and more wet plays that the children have seen in a while. I am really proud of how they have behaved during these times. I am particularly proud of the enterprising skills that some of our children display, making Loom Band jewellery and trading cards. Whilst I am more than happy for children to play with these during break and lunch times, there are a couple of points to note. Please be aware that anything brought in from home by the child, is done so at their own risk. We are not responsible for these items if they are lost or damaged. Items from home must not be taken into class. They must stay in bags and/or lockers during learning time. Any item that is brought into class will be confiscated by the class teacher and returned to the child at the end of the school day.

With the wet weather seeming more inevitable meaning slippery surfaces, I once again ask that any child riding to school, on bikes or scooters, wears a helmet. I cannot enforce this but I am sure that, as a parent, you want the same thing for your child as I do - for them to be safe and not come to harm through an entirely avoidable injury. If you would like support if having this conversation with your child, to help them understand the importance of wearing a helmet, please email myself or one of the pastoral team - we are more than happy to support you with this.

After the amazing success of our reading cafes (which will happen monthly going forward), we will be introducing monthly Maths cafes after half term. This is an opportunity for you to come in and work with your child on their journaling (don't worry - they will lead you). Look out for the dates in our newsletter and on our parents calendar.

Lastly, please remember that Prime bottles (with or without Prime in) are not allowed in school and will be exchanged for water or juice. Class teachers will handback the bottles at the end of the day.

What is a DSL?

A designated safeguarding lead (DSL) is a member of staff who has received specialist training in whole school safeguarding. A DSL will manage safeguarding in school, deliver training to all staff and will also work with outside agencies to help keep children safe.

A DSL will also follow up any concerns that have been raised about the safety and wellbeing of a child.



If you have concerns about the safety and wellbeing of a child, then you can always pass this on to a member of staff. Alternatively, any member of the public can ring the Norfolk Children's Advice and Duty Service (CADS) on 0344 800 8020.

Sometimes following up safeguarding questions means having difficult conversations with parents and carers. These conversations are necessary in order to do our job and to develop our understanding of a situation and what we can do to help.

Highlights from our week


Nursery

Year 4


Year 4 had a great time during their hockey trip this afternoon at Harleston Magpies!
