#### What is a DSL?

A designated safeguarding lead (DSL) is a member of staff who has received specialist training in whole school safeguarding. A DSL will manage safeguarding in school, deliver training to all staff and will also work with outside agencies to help keep children safe.

A DSL will also follow up any concerns that have been raised about the safety and wellbeing of a child. If you have concerns about the safety and wellbeing of a child, then you can always pass this on to a member of staff. In RE we had some puzzles to complete! We found out they showed two different versions of the Nativity story. We then looked at the similarities and differences between them.








In geography this week we have been exploring different land use in Norwich. This involved looking at different maps and understanding grid references.
