We are incredibly proud of the support and provision that is in place for children and families with regards to Special Education Needs and Disability (SEND) across our school. The level of care, intervention and the outcomes achieved by our young people are recognised by the Local Authority as a real strength of our school. PUPIL PREMIUM FUNDING

Pupil Premium Funding

If your child is eligible for 'free school meals' and you register them for this, we'll receive extra funding called 'pupil premium'. We use this extra money to improve the educational provision and resources at the school.

What is pupil premium funding?

Pupil premium funding from the government is given to schools to help students, regardless of their background or financial situation. It's provided for students who:

- Are registered for free school meals
- Have been registered for free school meals at any point in the past 6 years
 - Are, or have been, in care
 - Have parents in the armed forces

What is a DSL?

A designated safeguarding lead (DSL) is a member of staff who has received specialist training in whole school safeguarding. A DSL will manage safeguarding in school, deliver training to all staff and will also work with outside agencies to help keep children safe.

A DSL will also follow up any concerns that have been raised about the safety and wellbeing of a child.



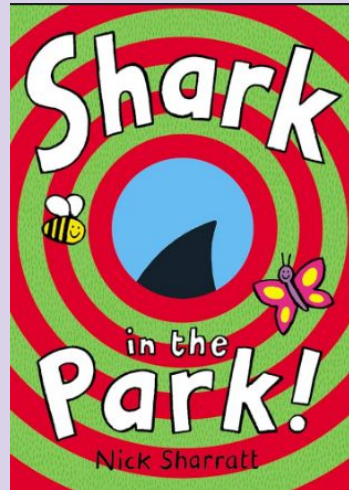

Nursery

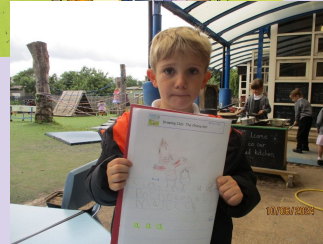
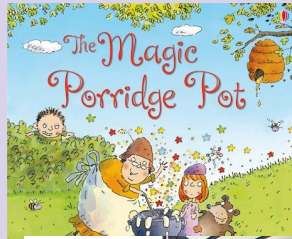

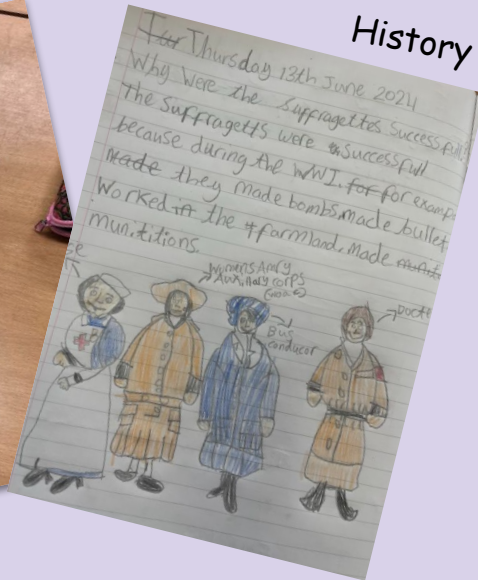
Year 3
