Message from Mrs Price

Cycling Helmets Again.... I appreciate that it is a parental choice as to whether a child wears a helmet whilst riding a bike or scooter to school. There is no law to insist that this happens. But I do have to wonder why any parent would not want to protect their child from the significant harm that could happen to their child should they come off their bike or scooter. It only takes one knock in the right (wrong) place for life changing injury or death to occur. All of which would be entirely preventable if the child wore a helmet. From September, we will be looking at how we can protect children riding bikes and scooters to and from school without helmets. Some schools have banned children from bringing their bikes and scooters onto the school site unless they are wearing a helmet, or allowing them to ride home unless a helmet is provided or the bike/scooter is collected by the parent. These are some of the options that we are looking into in order to help support the safety of our children on the roads. In September we will once again be running the Bikeability scheme for children in KS2. So that all families have advance notice, they are only able to access these sessions if they have a bike and a helmet.

Thank you to everyone who braved the weather and attended the Summer Gala last weekend. As soon as I have a grand total, I will update you.

Finally looking forward to the really nice weather that we are expecting over the last few weeks of term. With this in mind, please ensure that children come to school with sunscreen on, with a hat and a water bottle. We are unable to apply sunscreen to children, but they are welcome to have this in their bags to apply themselves.

Arts Festival



Wednesday 3rd July 2024 - 1:15 - 3:15 pm

Following on from the success of last year, we will soon be hosting our annual Arts Festival. The event will take place on **Wednesday 3rd July** and all children from the Primary Phase from Reception to Year 6 will be taking part. The festival will be a fantastic opportunity for all pupils to showcase the amazing learning they have been doing this year within the arts, linked to the theme of our school values: hope, perseverance, wisdom, love, respect and faith. In the build up to the event, each year group will be spending the next couple of weeks working on an exhibition, which will be a culmination of all of the skills they have practised in their art lessons this year. These art showcases will be on display on the playground, along the back of 6H classroom and in the Upper School Hall. Parents are invited to view the artwork, at their leisure, during the course of the afternoon.

In addition to the artwork, children will be performing a programme of song and dance on the school field. Each child will be involved in singing our whole school song, as well as performing once with their year group. We have also invited performances from the KS2 choir, Music Theatre club and the Secondary Phase choir. Parents who wish to watch any/all of the performances are encouraged to bring a blanket and join us on the field.

Running parallel to these acts, while KS1 are performing on the main stage, in the Upper School Hall, our peripatetic teachers will be showcasing the talent of our KS2 piano and guitar students, for those who wish to support our musicians during their performances.

Parents are invited to arrive at school from 1:00pm, in preparation for a 1:15pm start. Please enter through the upper playground side gate. Though timings are approximate, we hope that all performances will be finished by 3:05pm, so children can be collected by their parents as usual at the end of the school day from the classrooms.

In the event of bad weather, we plan to postpone the Arts Festival to Friday 5th July. We will inform you of this change on the morning of the event if necessary.

Designated Safeguarding Leads (DSLs)

What is a DSL?

A designated safeguarding lead (DSL) is a member of staff who has received specialist training in whole school safeguarding. A DSL will manage safeguarding in school, deliver training to all staff and will also work with outside agencies to help keep children safe.

A DSL will also follow up any concerns that have been raised about the safety and wellbeing of a child.



If you have concerns about the safety and wellbeing of a child, then you can always pass this on to a member of staff. Alternatively, any member of the public can ring the **Norfolk Children's Advice and Duty Service (CADS) on 0344 800 8020.**

Sometimes following up safeguarding questions means having difficult conversations with parents and carers. These conversations are necessary in order to do our job and to develop our understanding of a situation and what we can do to help.

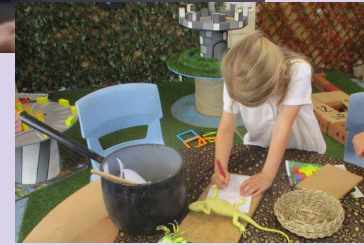
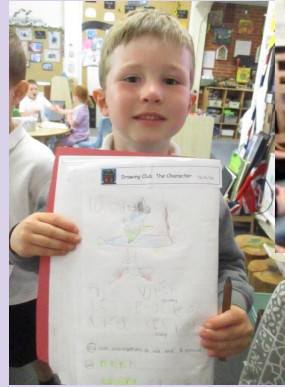
Nursery

We have been enjoying our unit of poetry. We have discussed how poems are different and can be about anything! We have looked out for if they included rhyme, alliteration and rhythm.



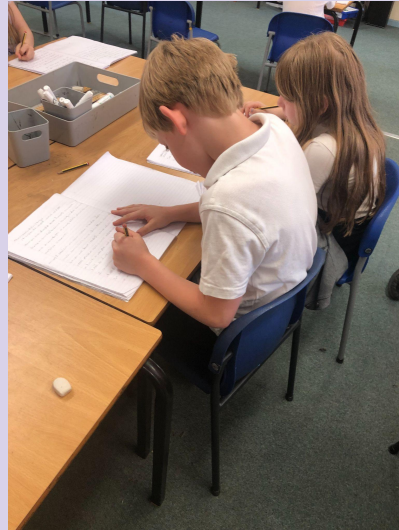
We started our new RS Enquiry Question- Why do people have different views about the idea of God?
